If either of the following happens:

A) 5 or more birds in a flock have a Soiled Feather Score of 2

B) The Litter Quality Assessment gives litter scores of more than 1

Then you must do the following:

1) Complete an intervention plan to improve litter quality and ensure that feather soiling does not deteriorate further

2) Conduct an additional Soiled Feather Assessment for the flock in the week prior to slaughter

3) Conduct an additional Litter Quality Assessment for the flock in the week prior to slaughter
